As we near the end of 2024, I'm thrilled to share our latest newsletter, filled with inspiring news and stories.






I'd also like to take this opportunity to share with you a remarkable achievement by Matt Vince, his family, and friends, who took on the Three Peaks Challenge in the summer, raising over £45,000 in memory of Matt's daughter, Luna-Rose, who sadly passed away in October 2022. Luna-Rose had attended our pre-school group, Aquamovers, at Chailey Heritage with her mum, Sam. The group provided valuable support for the family, and Sam said it was a life-changer for her.

Matt began fundraising in April 2023 by running the Brighton Marathon, his first marathon, raising an incredible £25,000 for the charity. But he didn't stop there. In the summer, he and a team of 13 took on the Three Peaks Challenge and cycled between each peak, covering over 450 miles in just four days—through flash floods and all!

When Matt and the team cycled into the riding arena for the Victory Parade at Chailey Heritage to hand over the cheque, the children, young people, and their support teams cheered and waved flags and some also cycled on their trikes as the group performed a moving lap of honour! It was an unforgettable scene.



On this uplifting note, I wish all our readers a wonderful Christmas. I hope this edition of Discover brings you joy as you read about the incredible achievements of the young people here.








# Transforming Dreams into Reality

Since launching in 2019, the immersive space in the Dream Centre has provided life-changing experiences for children and young people. This multi-sensory environment goes beyond entertainment—it's a vital tool that helps unlock personal development in areas such as education, emotional growth, and physical wellbeing.



"Creating this content is incredibly fulfilling," Mark says. "To see young people like Max engage in new ways makes all the effort worthwhile. It's about helping them connect with the world around them in a way that's meaningful to them."

Max's teacher explains how the space goes beyond entertainment - "The immersive space sparks curiosity. When Max shows interest, we build on that back in his personal targets — for example using a head switch to make choices — so when he sees something he likes in the underwater scene, a shark or particular fish, he uses his head switch to select more of that, enhancing his independence."



Tailored entirely to the individual, the immersive space empowers young people to engage with content that resonates with their interests and needs. For teaching and support teams, it's an invaluable tool that helps the individuals they support achieve personal targets, promoting both cognitive and emotional development.



## Max's Story: Bringing the Ocean to Life

Max who is 14 years old and has complex health needs, including sight impairments, loves the sea and underwater life. Thanks to our wonderful immersive space, he can now experience this passion in a whole new way. A bespoke designed 360-degree underwater scene featuring vibrant coral, colourful fish, sharks, using sharp contrasts allows Max to be fully immersed in this environment. For Max, this was a breakthrough - large visuals enabled him to react to changes in light, moving his head to follow the scenes and tracking images with his eyes, stimulating his eye muscles. It was an incredible moment for his family and support team to witness.

Our specialist content developer, Mark Elms, plays a critical role in making these immersive experiences come to life. Working closely with teachers and support teams, Mark creates content tailored to each young person's unique interests, personal goals, and learning curriculum, as well as supporting group sessions such as drama or immersive art.
